


Saturday Night Alive! October 8, 2016 5:30 p.m. - Sanctuary

RECIPE Russian Tea Cakes
.....
1 cup butter or margarine, softened
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
3/4 cup finely chopped pecans
1/4 teaspoon salt
Powdered sugar for rolling hot tea cakes
.....

1. Heat oven to 400°F.
2. Mix butter, 1/2 cup powdered sugar and the vanilla in large bowl. Stir in flour, nuts and salt until dough holds together.
3. Shape dough into 1-inch balls. Place about 1 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheet.
4. Bake 10 to 12 minutes or until set but not brown. Remove from cookie sheet. Cool slightly on wire rack.
5. Roll warm cookies in powdered sugar; cool on wire rack. Roll in powdered sugar again.



Celebration of children receiving Bibles




