



The Bahamas Work Team Report



Six work team members representing 4 congregations in the Wichita area recently returned from working 8 days in The Bahamas. The churches were in need of work after Hurricane Matthew in 2016. They stayed on the island of New Providence near the capital, Nassau.

On Sunday, the team was divided and attended different churches. Each group was recognized in the service and welcomed by each congregation. The team then had lunch with a church family and spent the afternoon visiting with them. Many of the people met on Sunday were seen throughout the week. The church members brought meals for lunch and supper every day, and provided transportation. On Saturday, they took them on a tour of the island.

The work week began on Monday with Phillips Roker, the contractor. The focus was to complete 2 painting projects. At Coke Memorial Church, 2 days were spent painting inside and outside of the small church. The next 3 days were spent at The

Children's Club and Thrift Shop located in the Methodist Mission Centre. The building was given to the church 10 years ago with the stipulation that it be used for charitable work. It has become a com-munity outreach program to assist with the development of underprivileged children. The team watched as up to 70 children arrived on Friday afternoon to learn social skills, sing songs, practice computer skills, learn scripture, and sing the national anthem. At the end of the afternoon session, each child was given a plate of food to share with their family. An inspiration to the team each day was when Bishop Theopolis Rolle visited us at the site. Rev. Rolle is the bishop of the Bahamas, Turks & Caicos Islands Conference.

The completion of the painting was a much appreciated accomplishment, but to the team, the friendships formed with the Nassau Circuit of Methodist church members was the most valuable part of the trip. God is certainly present in the lives of the Bahamian Methodists.




