



UMW Prepares to Celebrate 150 Years Being in Mission! March 23, 2019

To celebrate this upcoming achievement, United Methodist Women will participate in a skit entitled, "That Handful of Women" at their February 14, 2018 Unit Meeting that re-enacts the beginning of the UMW, nearly 150 years ago.

One stormy night on March 23, 1869, Mrs. Edwin Parker and Mrs. William Butler, wives of two missionaries to India, told six women at the Tremont Street Methodist Episcopal Church in Boston, Massachusetts, they discovered that girls in India were

uneducated and there were only male doctors who would not treat women. They had a plan that required them to be a bit unruly but not do anything that would upset the men. The plan was to raise money to send Clara Swain, a doctor, and Isabella Thoburn, an educator, to India as missionaries to serve the women of that nation. The six women decided to raise money by wearing calico dresses instead of silk, etc. and with a pledge of 2 cents per week, raised enough money to send these two women to India.

UMW members today contribute to the Legacy Fund, giving over and above their yearly pledge. Monies received by March 23 are matched dollar for dollar. The Legacy Fund, a forward looking permanent endowment, assures a firm foundation for future generations of United Methodist Women to do mission work with women, youth and children.
