Stove Builders of Guatemala and Giving Tuesday

Many of you know that the Stove Builders of Guatemala project was started at First Church Wichita in 2011. This project was created to help build cleaner and safer stoves for the indigenous Mayan people of Guatemala. As the project expanded, more funding was needed so other Methodist churches were invited to be partner churches to help spread the word and increase the areas in which new funding could be obtained. In 2016, this project was approved to be an Advance project with the United Methodist Board of Global Ministries. This opened the project to be supported by United Methodist churches across the world. In 2017, it was decided to move the administration of this project to one of the partner churches in Texas, First United Methodist Richardson. The project has continued to grow and by this fall, the project will have provided over 1,400 stoves to the Mayan families, since its inception in 2011.

However, there are still many families who could use a stove and that brings us to Giving Tuesday. Giving Tuesday is a “giving event” established, in 2012, to allow individuals to make charitable contributions to the non-profit of their choice. Giving Tuesday, this year, is Tuesday, November 27. The Stove Builders of Guatemala would greatly appreciate your consideration of a donation to the project to help continue the building of stoves for Mayan families. First Church is a big place and a lot is going on. As Rev. Evelyn Fisher says, “A church should be doing so many things that nobody knows everything.” This column is intended to introduce you to some of those things that you may have yet to learn about.

Room 208C is now being used as a Wichita office for EmberHope/Youthville. Their main office is in Newton. The office here at First Church is used by Lori Gonzales, Chief Program Officer. She would be glad to say hello to visitors.

As explained on the organization’s website, a century ago, “the United Methodist Church recognized the need for a residence for homeless and abandoned children. The mission was adopted to provide shelter and care to these children.”

First Church is helping to fulfill that mission by providing office space as well as space for training prospective foster parents. There are eight families enrolled in the foster parent training right now. Currently, there are 208 foster homes in Kansas. EmberHope/Youthville also serves 45 girls at the residential campus in Newton.

We appreciate the college gear shirts.

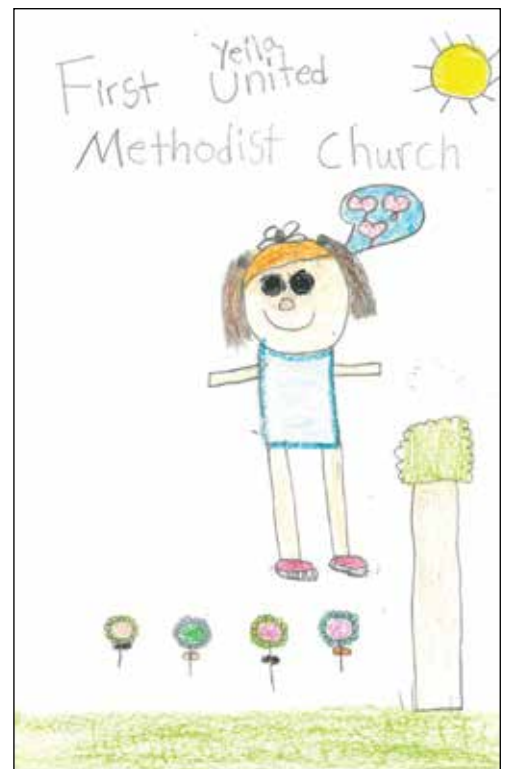
God will always love you

The mission emphasis for November is collecting gloves to warm the hands of our neighborhood children. Park School Social Worker, Lori Mueller, shared that many more children are walking to school this year, and they are in desperate need of gloves. Of course, coats and hats are always welcome, but the real missing piece of protective outer wear seems to be gloves.

Our Park School community hovers at about 97% poverty, even though parents are working one or two jobs. Lori recently stated, "Our poor children just seem to be getting poorer." That may seem odd to us, but the wages are not rising at the same rate as the cost of groceries, clothes, utilities, etc.

All types of gloves are requested, from



those for little children's hands through adult sizes. Stretchy type gloves that are packaged in sets of 2 or 3 and sell at a lower price are welcomed as well as

gloves with more lining. Mittens are also a good choice.

The donation of cold weather outer wear for our neighborhood children is

appreciated throughout the winter. With the closing of Mead's Corner and the loss of the Tip Jar donations from there, funds to purchase items for the children has declined. Thus, financial contributions are always appreciated and the School Ministry Task Force will use donations for current needs for our families. Checks should be made to the church with the notation of "School Ministries." They may be placed in the offering or the vault drop outside the office, or mailed to the church.

As the cold weather arrives, it's time to dig out your own gloves and find a pair to share. We have about 350 neighborhood children at Park. Let's try to warm all 700 hands!

How about your class or group forming a team? Or you can be an individual participant. You can dress as a pilgrim, a turkey, a pumpkin pie or just dress for the weather!

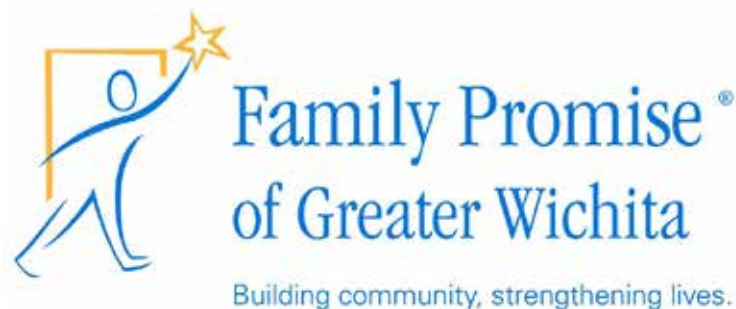

Family Promise Update Volunteers Needed

Volunteers are needed to help with Family Promise! The first 3 families will be here the week of December 16. Do you have a little time that you could help by volunteering? Here is what we need.

- One driver to take families to the Day Center in the morning and a driver to pick them up in the evening from the Day Center and bring them to the church. You will drive the Family Promise van. You must have a valid driver's license.
- A family, group or individual to bring an evening meal and serve to the families (about 15 people). You may also eat with the families and get to know them. You can also drop off a meal to be served. (Meals will be served Sunday night through Saturday night.)
- Food donations for a "to-go" breakfast and items to make a sack lunch.

- Each night we will need one adult male and one adult female to stay overnight in the D building with the families. You will be there to answer questions, help in an emergency and sleep.
- In the evening we would like to have an individual spend some time with the families. Play games, read to the children, help with homework for both children and adults.
- A laundry volunteer to wash bedding and towels at the end of the week.
- Volunteers to help after Downtown Alive on Sunday to set up cots and the rooms. The following Sunday we will also need volunteers to help prepare the rooms for classes.

All volunteers will be required to have Safe Gatherings and will also have a brief training session with Family Promise, on Sunday, December 2 at 4:00 p.m. Sign-up sheets are available at the A-B or D Information Desks and in the Narthex

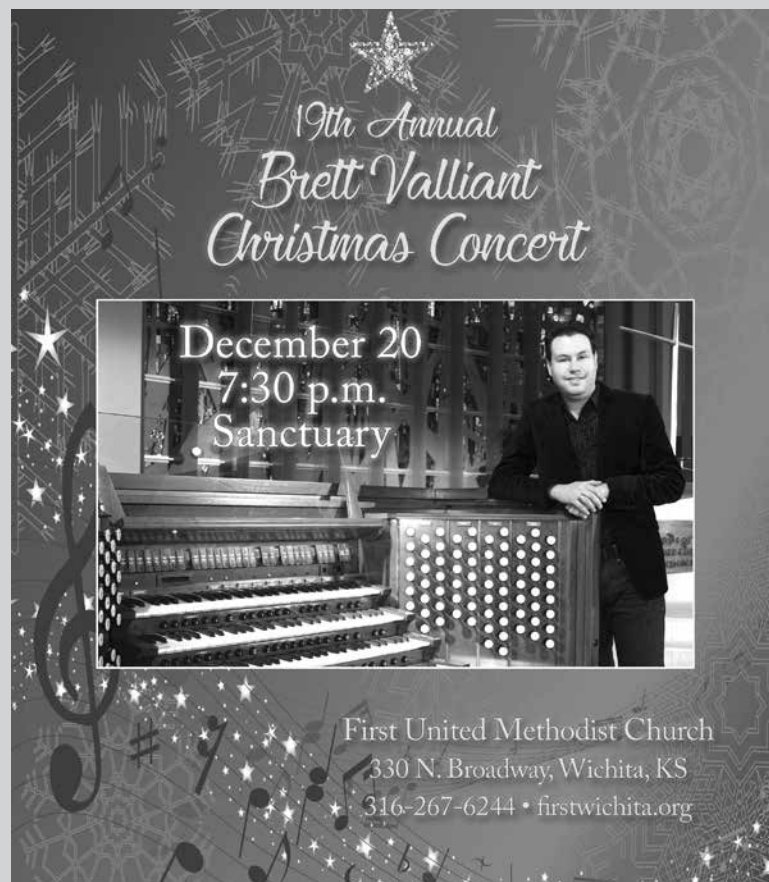
Koinonia 303D

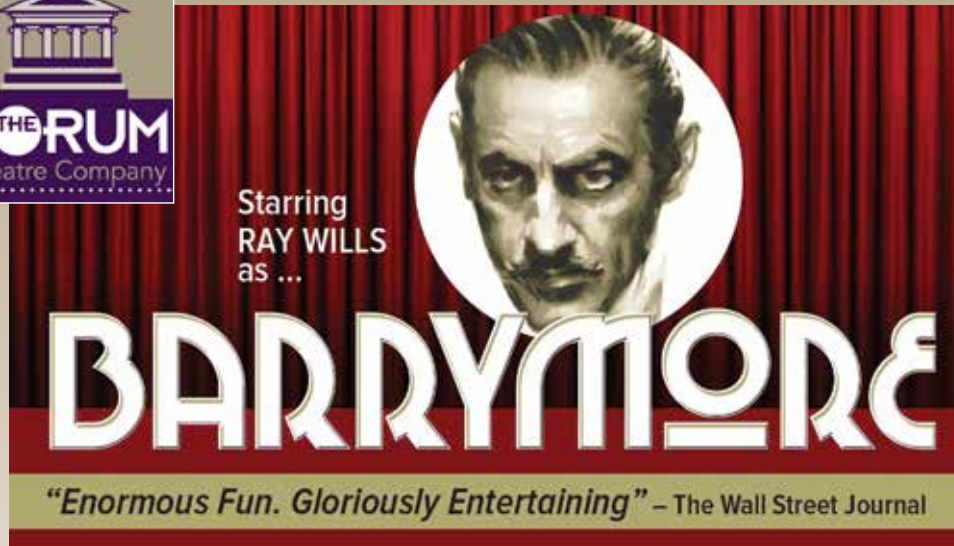
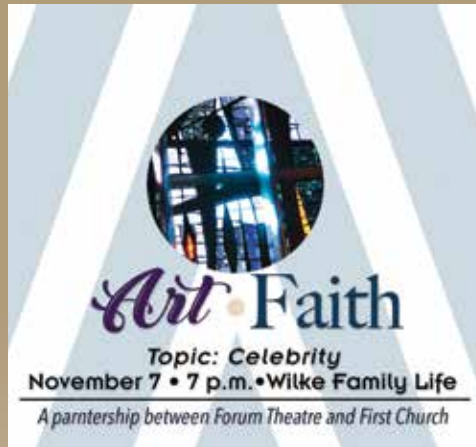

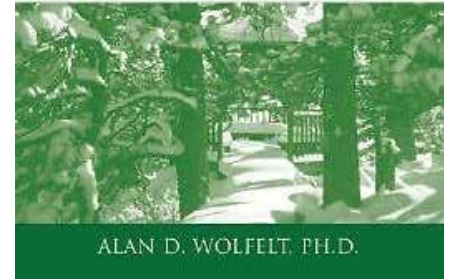


The Forum Theatre Wichita's 2018-2019 season continues in November with "Barrymore".
