





2021-22 Scholarship Applications now available

Each year, the Scholarship Committee of First United Methodist Church awards scholarships to church members who wish to pursue a postsecondary education. This includes, but is not limited to, graduating high school seniors, students already attending college, and seminary students. Scholarships are funded through named endowments and other gifts to the church specified for scholarships. Students are eligible to receive a scholarship from the church for up to five years, provided they meet the scholarship requirements. A new application is required each year.

The School Ministries Task Force will purchase needed items for the children. Thus, financial gifts to cover these expenses may be sent to the church marked,


"School Ministries winter wear". Our neighborhood families are very grateful to the congregation for winter items given to their children.






