





Double Ring

Long-time Double Ring Class member Gerald Beals passed away on May 11. His funeral was held May 18, at First United Methodist Church. Please keep his wife Mary and their family in your prayers.

Class teacher Jack Focht continued his lessons on the letters of Paul with those found in Galatians. Paul had previously preached to these people in person and stayed there for about a year and had impressed upon them that it was not necessary for them to follow all Jewish laws, including circumcision, in order to be Christian. Later, others had come to Galatia and told them that they did have to follow all of the Jewish laws. In the Galatians letter, Paul preached that "...yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified." Galatians 2:16. He emphasized to them again, "For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love." Galatians 5:6. He told them, "For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" Galatians 5:14.

Paul wrote his first letter to the Corinthians because he had been told of the quarreling among the people. In this letter to the church at Corinth, Paul covered a number of different issues related to both life and doctrine: divisions and quarrels, sexual immorality, lawsuits among believers, marriage and singleness, freedom in Christ, order in worship, the significance of the Lord's Supper, and the right use of spiritual gifts; he also included a profound teaching on the resurrection. But this letter might be best known for these beautiful words regarding the Way of Love, which Jack read to us: "If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast,[b] but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part, but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. For now, we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." -1 Corinthians 13.

On May 21, Betty Moore gave us the 43-year history of the Downtown Day Care Center, which from her ideas had originally been started at First UMC, and then eventually moved to other locations. The organization was a blessing to families in which both parents worked, and it served families who are in financial need. Because of the untimely closing of their last facility, they are now seeking donations for what they hope will be called the Center City Academy in the downtown area.
