



# Social Skills Workshop August 27 at 12:30 p.m.

On Sunday, August 27, beginning at 12:30 p.m., you are encouraged to attend the Social Skills Workshop. They will help participants to understand the social skills Pastor Amy preaches about throughout the August series by using the framework of marriage and family therapy. There will be breakout sessions, as well as topical discussions based around communication, conflict resolution, listening, empathy, and respect. # Chapel Window Repair and Protection

Last November, First Church facilities discovered that one of the Chapel windows had been broken and required extensive repair.

In May, this repair was completed by Rayer's Bearden Stained Glass Supply, who specialize in this type of work. Luckily, they had in stock some of the original German fired glass that was used in the window. The cost of this repair was \$6,500 and paid for by generous members, Sunday school classes, and Memorial funds.

In addition to repairing the damaged window, we received a quote of an additional \$6,500, to add protection to the exterior of these windows to prevent further damage. The project has been approved and plans are underway for Rayer's to install custom cut protective Lexan for each of the 6 lower windows. Before the installation, they will also clean and polish the exterior of each window to return them like new condition.

The Chapel is a very dear and special place for many in our church. While we have received some funds for this project, we are seeking additional donations to help with this cost as it is not in the current budget. Any excess funds received will go into the facilities budget to help with future projects. We feel this is an important and necessary step to complete as soon as possible in order to protect these beautiful windows! 

# **Park tutors**

In March 2006, First Church established a partnership with Park School, a pre-kindergarten through fifth grade elementary school located nearby at 1025 N. Main. One of our original goals was to raise student achievement and self-esteem. To this end, First Church congregants are encouraged to participate in tutoring students once a week for about an hour at Park. During this time, tutors usually meet with two small groups of two or three students in a room designated for tutoring. Students are selected by their teachers because they need help in academics and relationships.

Volunteer tutors can choose a grade level and a time which works well with their schedules. Students may need help recognizing letters and simple spelling to reading chapter books together, discussing plot and vocabulary as it appears in the stories.

Tutors from this past year were asked about their tutoring experience. They said:

It was rewarding to watch the children make progress in their reading.

I have no children at home, so it was fun to have this relationship with kids.

We had a really good time together. There's nothing like laughing with children!

All tutors must be current on their Safe Gatherings. In addition, a one-time training will be provided for new tutors and held at the church in late August. Also, USD 259 requires a yearly online background check for volunteers but at no cost to the tutors.




# **Open Door Urgent Need**
