# A Message from Amy

Dear First Church,

I've been busy meeting our neighbors! This is one of the fun things about moving to a new place, the chance to explore what's going on around you. In the last few weeks, I have met with the pastor at City Life Church (which meets in the former First Baptist building across Broadway), the Vicar of St John's Episcopal Church (caddy-corner to us) and the Major of the Salvation Army (also across Broadway from the church). I have plenty of more neighbors to meet but spending time with these three committed and talented leaders was a good start to get to know who is in the neighborhood.

For both City Life Church and the Episcopal Church I made sure to ask to see their sanctuaries. Partly this was because I love sanctuaries! But also, it was because I think a sanctuary gives the best clues as to the "vibe" of a church. And I discovered that City Life, St John's Episcopal and First Church are all very different! Our sanctuary is actually the newest among the three. St John's is from the 1880s and is full of dark wood carvings, classic stained glass windows and biblical symbolism everywhere. City Life is a very new church, not much more than a decade old, but their sanctuary was built in the late 40s and is very simple. Except for the two rose stained-

glass windows, it could be mistaken for a community auditorium. It even has theatre style seats rather than pews.

Of course, I am partial to the mid-century awesomeness of our sanctuary. I have really come to love that space, along with the Narthex and the Broadway entrance to the A building. It is all modern, yet retro, somehow both new and classic at the same time. It is both grand and inviting. It is different than any other sanctuary or building near to us.

It has me asking, "what else about First Church is different than any other church or building near to us?" We occupy unique real estate but I hope we also offer unique community and connection to people in Wichita. There is room for lots of different churches in this city, and in downtown. Our question is, who will want to come be a part of our kind of Christian community? How can we reach those who will best find a church home here, in our mid-century marvel? With the particular way we read the scriptures, with the ways we reach out in mission, with the way we follow Jesus, who can best find a home here?

These are not new questions, but they are imperative ones as we are in danger of not passing on our faith, our legacy, and our building to a new generation of Christians. I hope you will join me in praying for First

## An Update on The Gathering

The Gathering worship service first started at Mead's Corner sometime around 2007 as a way to reach a different population, one that would not be interested to come to worship in the Sanctuary on Sunday morning. For many years a faithful group met The at Mead's Corner. When Mead's closed The Gathering moved to New Covenant UMC in Delano and then when COVID hit, The Gathering moved into the D building. All of those moves were difficult for the community and especially moving into the church building made it hard to reach folks in the way originally envisioned at Mead's Corner. Additionally, personnel and leadership changes have made it hard to sustain momentum

Beyond the band and staff, there have been 5-10 people regularly in attendance these last months.

After much conversation, prayer, and reflection, the Leadership Board, Rev.

Amy Lippoldt, and the participants on Sunday nights have come to the decision to stop The Gathering as a worship service, effective September 24. Those who have attended the Gathering have been a faithful and caring community. We are grateful for their participation and ministry, and especially for the leadership of Kate Davis and Arthur McClendon. A whole lot of lives have been impacted and shaped by the ministry of The Gathering over these 16 years.

When we talked about hopes for The Gathering, one thing that was said clearly was people wanted a way to be in community with our unhoused neighbors. They see this as crucial to our discipleship. To that end, we are going to take a break during the month of October. But November 5, The Gathering will reconvene as a small group focused on Bible study and outreach to our unhoused neighbors. It will meet at 12:30 p.m. in Room 103B and everyone who is interested is welcome to come!

Double Ring teacher Jack Focht has recently discussed how religion first started, why people need God in their lives, and some of the world's oldest religions. We learned how Abraham played a role in multiple religions. Jack is currently focusing on the Book of Revelation, which was written by John, to seven churches in Asia. He will continue this subject for several lessons. Jack also read a fun article by Garrison Keillor about Methodists to us. Here's a small sample: "...I do believe this: People, these Methodists, who love to sing in four-part harmony are the sort of people you can call up when you're in deep distress. If you're dying, they will comfort you. If you are lonely, they'll talk to you. And if you are hungry, they'll give you tuna salad or a casserole. Methodists believe in prayer but would practically die if asked to pray aloud. Methodists like to sing, except when confronted with a new hymn or a hymn with more than six stanzas...."

We have enjoyed having visits from Pastors Amy and Rebecca to our class, which give us great opportunities to ask questions and get to know them better. Double Ringers always love having visitors. You are welcome to join us and have a cup of coffee!


