

BUILDING UPDATE

Dear First Church,

At their July 28 meeting, your Leadership Board took an important next step in our building use plan by voting on a list price for the C and D buildings. Earlier in the year we decided to have realtors from JP Weigand & Sons represent us as we look for the best way to handle having more building than we need for our ministry.

If you attended the "building utilization meeting" in February, you will remember we talked about different possibilities related to the C and D building. Options included leasing part or all of it, selling part or all of it, tearing down part or all of it. Our congregational conversation did not reveal a unified preference for one of those options and the Leadership Board has decided to continue moving forward with all three as a possibility. Listing the property for sale or lease is the next step in that process and will allow us to see who might be interested in what parts of the building.

Our sales price (totaling \$2.8 million for both C and D and the adjacent parking) is based on a commercial appraisal we received a few weeks ago. Church properties are unique and ultimately the building is worth what someone will pay for it. Time will tell what that ends up being. Even with this big step of listing, there are many questions still to be answered. If you hear friends or others talking about

"First Church being for sale" feel free to let them know that it is only the C and D buildings, we will be keeping A and B! We are not moving from downtown. And listing it for sale does not preclude leasing the space instead if the right partner comes along. We also have a list of deed restrictions we will attach to make sure we don't end up with a neighbor that would be at cross-purposes with our church's mission.

I ask you to continue to pray for this process. Pray that a great partner or buyer will come and use the space in a way that builds up downtown Wichita. Pray for our wisdom and discernment as a congregation. Feel free to email or call me with any questions!

Did you know...Every week approximately 20 persons from First Church, "go on a mission trip". They travel to the Open Door Community Food Ministry on 2130 E. 21st Street. Some work at the front desk answering the



phone and distributing intake forms—in three different languages. Others interview clients to keep their files updated. The distribution room workers load grocery carts and help clients to their cars with their food. Many of the First Church team work in the warehouse, filling boxes for the senior commodity programs or the Emergency Food Assistance Program boxes. Volunteers work a a variety of shifts. Most work every week but help is especially needed the third week of each month for the Senior program.

Volunteers keep this vital program alive in Wichita, and members and friends of First have answered the call.
